This fund supports charities and NHS organisations to expand proven health and care interventions and deliver them more widely.

The main focus is on projects underpinned by real-world evidence of effectiveness, with strong potential for adoption and integration at scale. This funding prioritises initiatives that can demonstrate sustainability, system-level benefit, and measurable improvements for people and services.
